The B.A. Economics degree offers specialized options in various areas. If you are completing an option, you must fill out the change of major form to officially declare it. For more specific course information about each option, please see Economics website for courses lists.

Options Available to ALL ECON BA Majors:

1. Global Trade and Finance

2. Money and Financial Markets

3. Public Policy and Sustainability

*Non-ECON courses may not count as an Economics Elective towards the Economics Major.

Requirements for the Economics Major:

- 1. ECON 401, 402, 605, 611, ADMN 420 and four ECON electives. (Note: ADMN 403 is a prerequisite for ADMN 420, therefore must be completed prior to taking ADMN420).
- 2. You must complete Calculus (Math 424A) <u>or</u> Finite (Math 420). This course should be completed by the end of your first year and may be used to satisfy the Quantitative Reasoning Discovery requirement. This requirement may also be satisfied by an approved transfer or AP course.
- 3. You must obtain at least a 2.0 grade point average in you major courses to graduate. Courses taken at other institutions are **NOT** averaged into the major GPA or cumulative GPA. Courses taken at UNH-Manchester, TSAS and Navitas are averaged into the cumulative GPA but **NOT** into the major GPA.
- 4. The minimum acceptable grade in a Paul College course is a C- (for ADMN 403 students must obtain credit). If you receive a grade below C- in a Paul College course, you must retake the course during the next semester. No more than two Paul College courses may be repeated and each course may be repeated one time (this includes ADMN 403).
- 5. You must satisfy the Bachelor of Arts foreign language requirement.

Requirements for all Paul College Students:

- 1. You need 128 credits to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree. You must make up the credits for a repeated course in order to graduate. If you have repeated a course you must complete a Repeated Course Form. You should check your credits each semester to insure that you have enough credits to graduate.
- 2. A repeated course must have the same Paul College course number (as the original course) as listed in the UNH-D catalogue to qualify as a repeated course. (Ex: ECN 412, Microeconomics, at UNH-Manchester, would not qualify as a repeated course for ECON 402, Microeconomics, at UNH-D.)
- 3. You must complete Ethics and Society (Phil 430) by the end of your first year and it may be used to satisfy the Humanities Discovery requirement.
- 4. In the first three semesters in Paul College students cannot take more than two major courses in a single semester.
- 5. Four Writing Intensive courses must be completed. (One must be a 600 level and one must be in your major.)
- 6. No writing intensive courses, discovery courses, major courses, minor courses or Paul College courses can be taken pass/fail by a Paul College student.
- 7. It is your responsibility to drop any courses for which you have registered and for which you have not met the prerequisites. You may be dropped at any time from courses when prerequisites have not been met.
- 8. Given the possibility that changes sometimes occur in course schedules (such as in the time or location of a course section), it is essential that you confirm your class schedule (via Webcat) the day before classes begin.
