Hospitality Management Requirements

- 1. The minimum acceptable grade in a Paul College course is a C- (for ADMN 403 students must obtain credit). If you receive a grade below C- in a Paul College course, you must retake the course during the next semester. No more than two Paul College courses may be repeated and each course may be repeated one time (this includes ADMN 403).
- 2. A repeated course must have the same Peter T. Paul College course number (as the original course) as listed in the UNH-D catalogue to qualify as a repeated course. (Ex: ECON 412, Microeconomics, at UNH-Manchester, would not qualify as a repeated course for ECON 402, Microeconomics, at UNH-D.)
- 3. You need 128 credits to graduate with a B.S. degree. You must make up the credits for a repeated course in order to graduate. If you have repeated a course you must complete a Repeated Course Form. You should review your credits each semester to insure that you have enough credits to graduate.
- 4. All HMGT majors must complete an **800** hour paid practicum.
- 5. You must obtain at least a 2.30 grade point average in your major courses to graduate. Courses that count in the major GPA are: all HMGT core courses (not Math) and HMGT electives.
- 6. Courses taken at other institutions are **NOT** averaged into the major GPA or cumulative GPA. Courses taken at UNH-Manchester are averaged into the cumulative GPA but **NOT** into the major GPA.
- 7. You must complete Calculus (Math 424A) or Finite (Math 420) by the end of your first year and it may be used to satisfy the Quantitative Reasoning Discovery requirement.
- 8. You must complete Ethics and Society (Phil 430) by the end of your first year and it may be used to satisfy the Humanities Discovery requirement.
- 9. Either ECON 401 or ECON 402 may be counted as a Social Science Discovery course.
- 10. In the first three semesters students cannot take more than two major courses in a single semester.
- 11. Four writing intensive courses must be completed. (One must be a 600-level and one must be in your major.)
- 12. No writing intensive courses, general education/discovery courses, major courses or minor courses can be taken pass/fail. Additionally, no Peter T. Paul College course may be taken on a pass/fail basis by a Paul College student.
- 13. It is your responsibility to drop any course(s) for which you have registered and for which you have not met the prerequisites. You may be dropped at any time from courses when prerequisites have not been met.
- 14. Given the possibility that changes sometimes occur in course schedules (such as in the time or location of a course section) it is essential that you review your class schedule (via webcat) the day before classes begin.
