If you are seeking full-time job or internship, now is the time to make a plan of action. Here are some ideas to get you started:

- 1. Get your documents in order, including a professional resume, cover letter and references.
- Research companies and roles that interest you and start looking for openings. <u>Wildcat Careers</u> is a great resource, but cast your net wider and search for openings on other sites such as <u>LinkedIn</u> or <u>Indeed</u>. Research and search sites specific to your area of interest, for example, if you are interested in sales or marketing check out <u>Sales Gravy</u> or <u>www.Inbound.org</u>.
- 3. Start networking! Talk to your peers, family, faculty and other contacts to discuss your plans and ask for advice. Explore LinkedIn and see if anyone in your network is connected with a company or role that interests you. Set up an informational interview, lead the discussion, ask probing questions and make it worth your time.
- 4. Plan ahead and attend the UNH Career Fair on March 1. To register and view list of employers, go to the Events section on <u>Wildcat Careers</u>. Other <u>events</u> include Resume Review Day and Mock Interview Day, both excellent opportunities to connect with recruiters!
- 5. Schedule an appointment with a Paul Career Counselor to strategize.
